Florida Learner's Permit

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- For the first three (3) months, you may not drive in the dark.
- After three (3) months, you may drive in the dark, but not after 10 P.M.
- ✓ People under 18 years of age must have 50 hours of driving experience prior to upgrading to their full license (Class E). Ten (10) of those hours must be nighttime hours accrued after the first three (3) months of having a Learner's License.
- There must be someone 21 years or older in the front passenger seat at all times.
- The person who signs for Parental Consent for a Driver Application of a minor will be liable for any negligence or willful misconduct of a minor under the age of 18 when driving a motor vehicle.
 - A foster parent, authorized representative of a residential group home or guardian ad litem may sign for the minor if the minor is enrolled in licensed out-of-home care. Signatories under this provision, do not assume any obligation or become liable for damages caused by the negligence or willful misconduct of the minor when driving a motor vehicle.
- ✓ People under 18 years of age must hold their Learner's License for at least one (1) year or until their 18th birthday prior to upgrading to their full license (Class E). If the minor receives a moving traffic conviction while they have a Learner's License, the one (1) year period will be extended for one (1) year from the date of the conviction or until they are 18 years old, whichever happens first.
